Questions to Consider	My Notes	Website Evaluation Practice URL:
<p>Currency: How recent is the information?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • When was the information published or posted? • Has the information been updated? • Does your topic need recent information, or will older sources work as well? • Are the links working? 		
<p>Author/ Authority: Does the info come from experts?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Who is the author/publisher/ sponsor? • Is the author expert enough to write on the topic? Google him/her! • Is there contact information? • Does the URL give clues? e.g. .com .edu .gov 		
<p>Reliability: Is the information accurate and unbiased?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Is the information supported by evidence? • Can you verify any of the information in another source or from personal knowledge? • Does the language or tone seem unbiased and free of emotion? • Are there spelling, grammar or typo errors? 		
<p>Purpose: The reason the information exists.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What is the purpose of the site? Is it to inform, teach, sell, entertain or persuade? • Do the authors/sponsors make their intentions or purpose clear? • Is the information fact, opinion or propaganda? • Does the point of view appear objective and impartial? • Are there political, ideological, cultural, religious, institutional or personal biases?
